Walthamstow return to league action on Saturday 13 September as they host Brantham Athletic at Wadham Lodge in the Isthmian League Division One North. Kick-off is scheduled for 3pm, and both sides will be eager to make a statement as the early stages of the season begin to take shape.

For Walthamstow, this fixture marks a return to league duties after a two-week break, during which they secured back-to-back cup victories. Their most recent outing saw them come from two goals down to defeat Downham Town in dramatic fashion in the FA Trophy, with goals from Olu Oluwatimilehin, Callum Ibe, and a late own goal sealing a memorable 3–2 win. That momentum could prove vital as they look to climb the league table.

Brantham Athletic, meanwhile, will be aiming to bounce back from a heavy 5–0 defeat away at Wroxham earlier in the week. The Imps have had a mixed start to the campaign and will be wary of a confident Walthamstow side, especially given their own defensive vulnerabilities on the road.

This match also carries a hint of revenge for Walthamstow, who were knocked out of the FA Cup by Brantham just over a month ago. That result will no doubt be fresh in the minds of the players and coaching staff, adding an extra edge to what promises to be a competitive encounter.

With attacking threats like Rasheed Salau and Brian Garzon in form, and a home crowd behind them, Walthamstow will be hopeful of securing all three points. But Brantham have shown they can be dangerous on their day, and will be looking to spoil the party once again.

Expect a lively atmosphere and a hard-fought contest as both teams look to assert themselves in the division.
